If You Have Experienced Sexual Misconduct

What To Do:

If you are in immediate danger or wish to report a crime, call 911.

A person who has experience sexual misconduct is encouraged to take the following immediate actions:

- Get to a safe place
- Contact Stephens Safety and Security of other law enforcement
- Call an advocate or advocacy organization
- Seek medical attention (try not to shower, brush teeth, or use the restroom)
- Preserve evidence (clothing, bedding, letters, photos, emails, texts, etc.)
- Write down everything you remember
- Seek counseling
- Contact parents, relatives, or close friends for support
- Report the incident at <u>www.stephens.edu/titleix</u>

It is the College's goal to empower individuals who believe they have experienced an incident of sex- or gender-based discrimination or harassment to make the decisions that are best for them. You do not have to choose a course of action immediately.

What To Know

- You set the pace for any action you choose to pursue.
- You have the right to choose to whom you will speak, what resources you will use, what you say, and when you will say it.
- There are many resources available to help you, both at Stephens College and in the community. Some resources are strictly confidential while all are private.
- It is your choice to name the other person(s) or not.
- Your information will be kept private and only shared with those who "need to know." We want to take care of you and keep you safe, and we want to make sure that others in the community are safe.
